Captain William Bligh in Dublin, 1800-1801

In 1801 he was in the thick of it at the Battle of Copenhagen, his ship next to that of Nelson's In what was for him a unique gesture of appreciation Nelson called Bligh to his flagship and personally congratulated him on his courage and abilities Bligh somewhat spoiled the occasion by requesting that these commendations be put in writing
